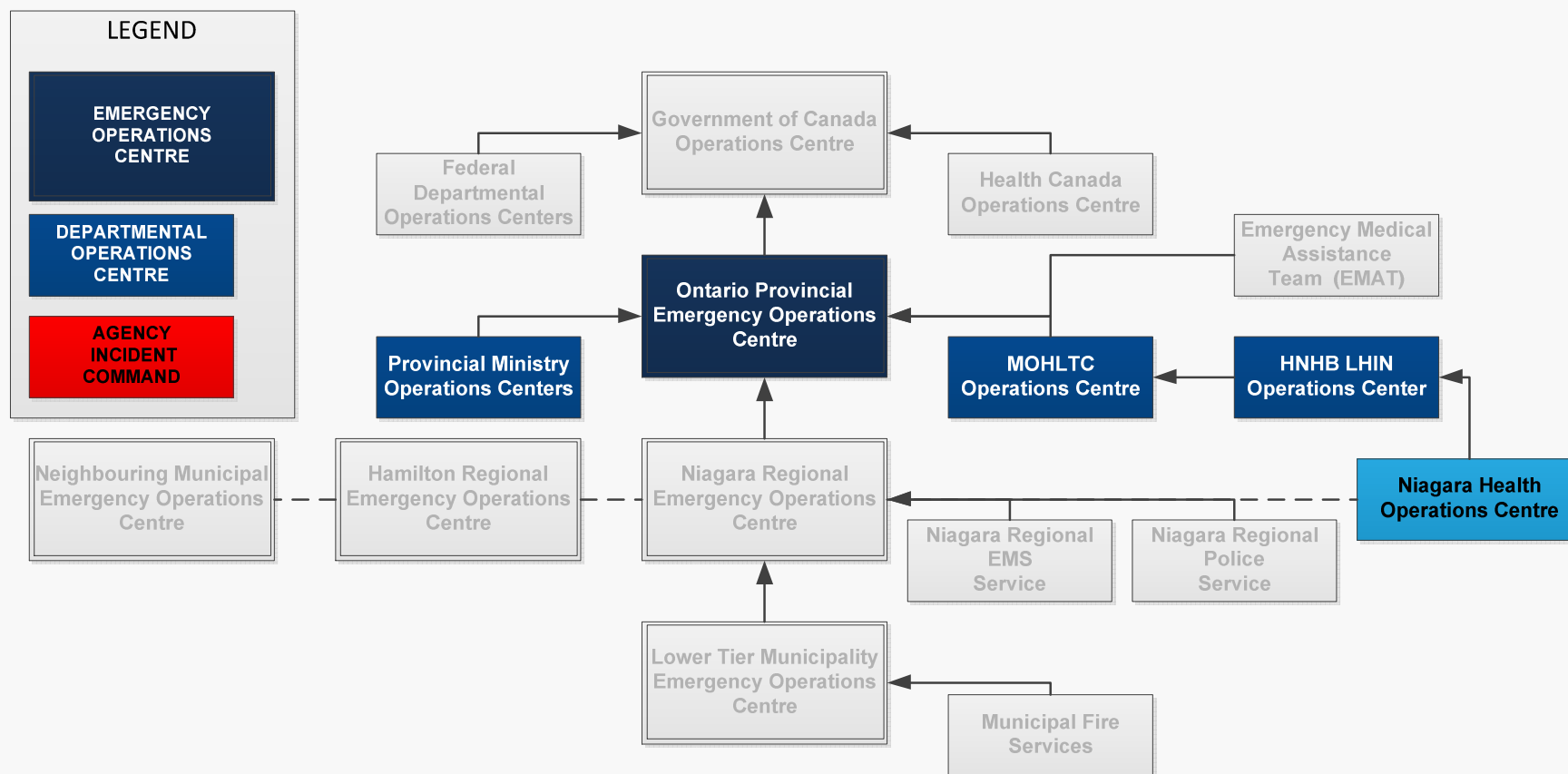


EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT: LOCAL COMMUNITY



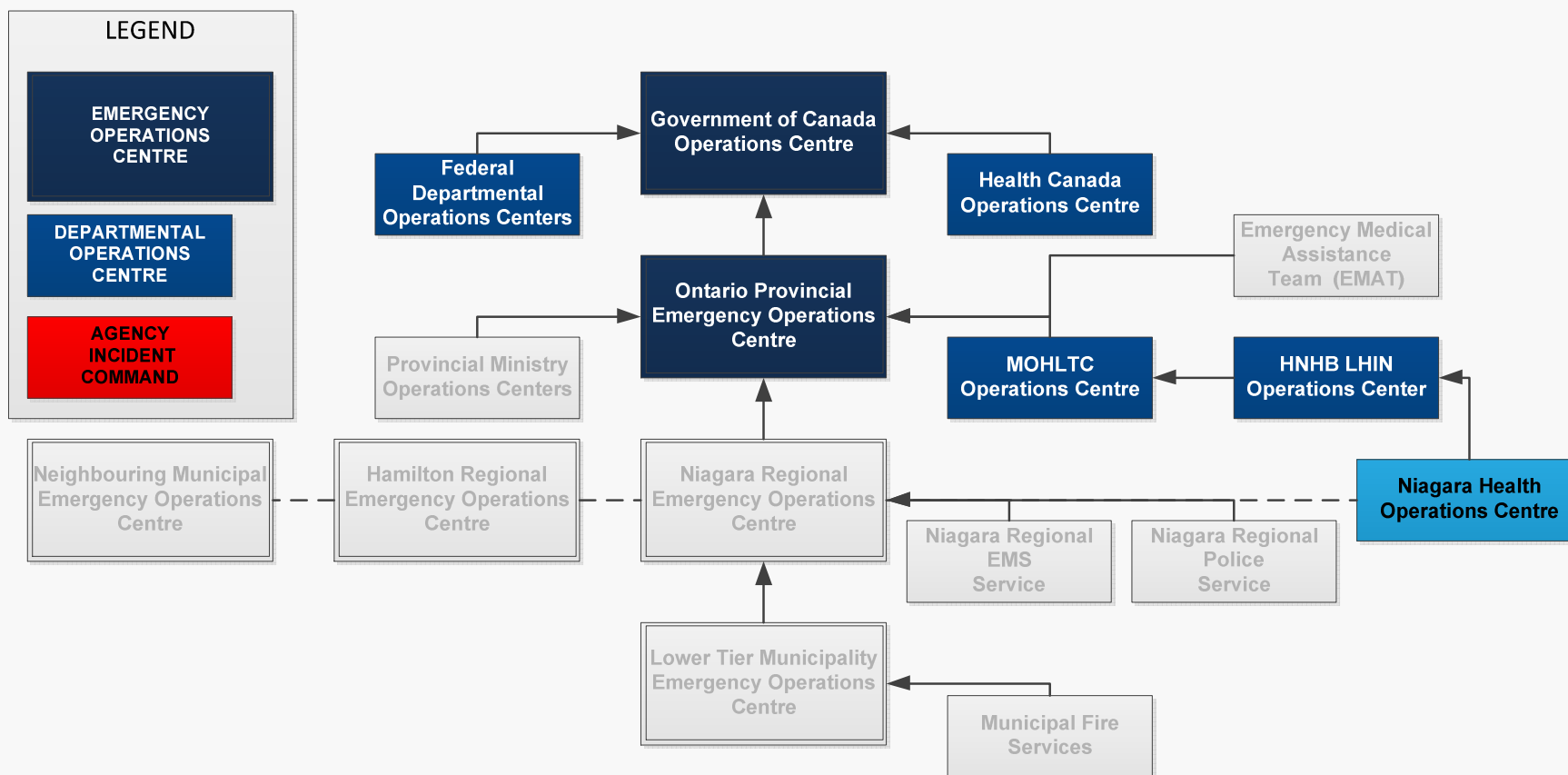


EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT: PROVINCIAL LEVEL



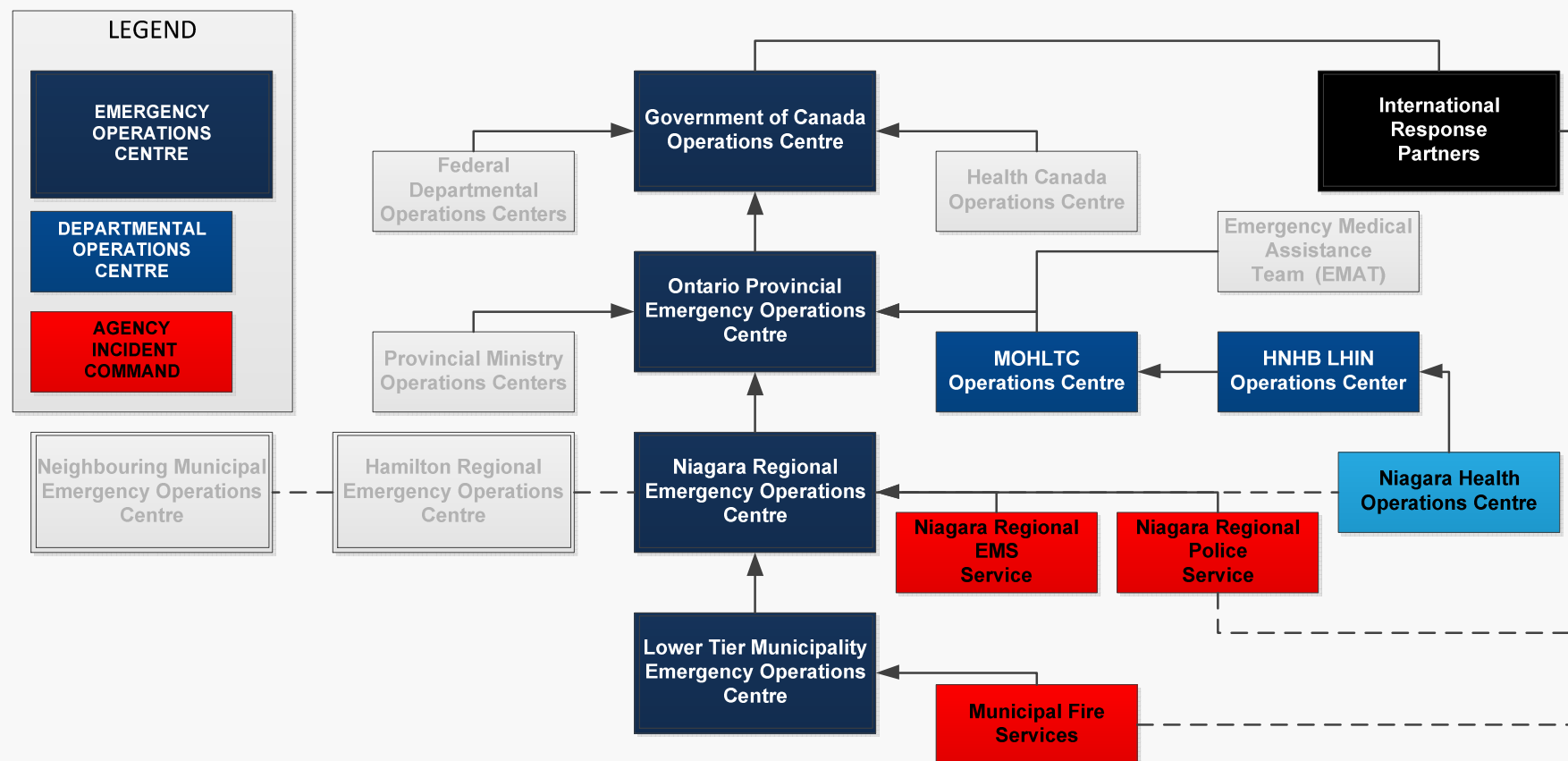


EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT: FEDERAL LEVEL

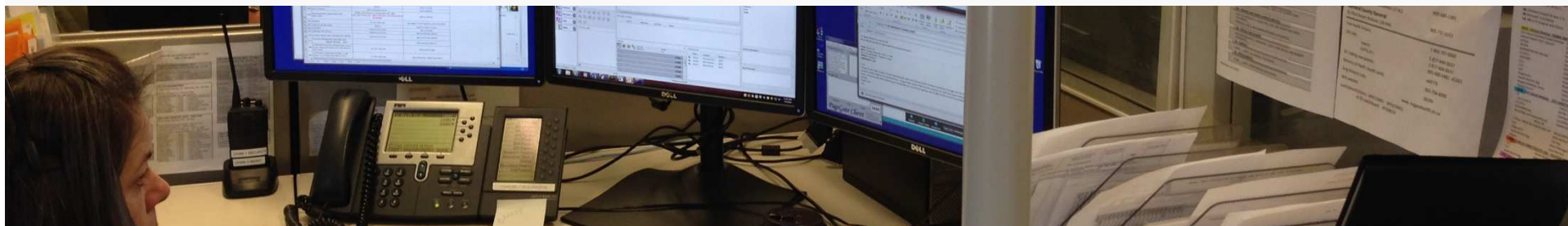

“IMS is a standardized approach to emergency management encompassing personnel, facilities, equipment, procedures and communications operating within a common organizational structure”

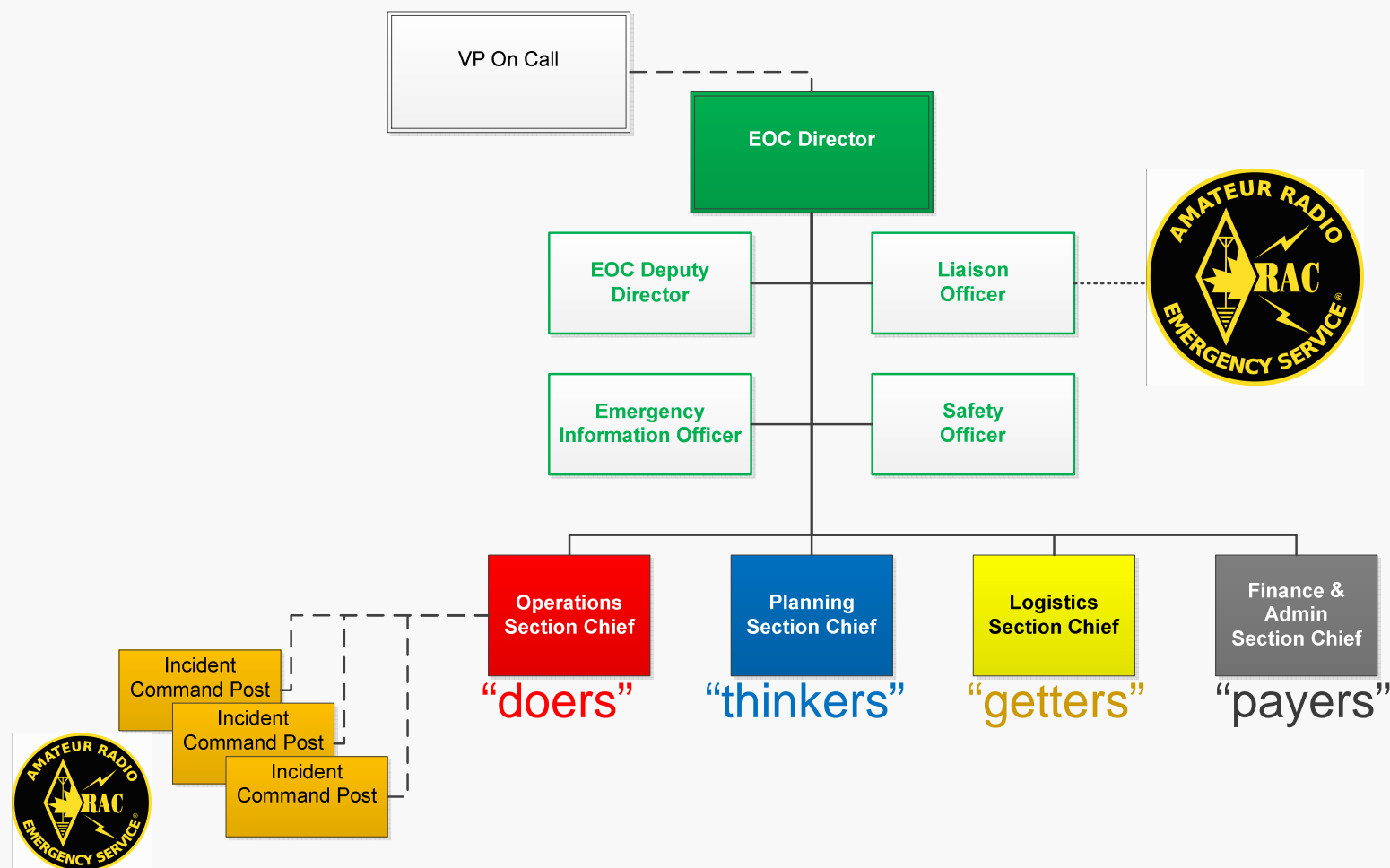
“IMS is predicated on the understanding that in any and every incident, there are certain management functions that must be carried out regardless of the number of persons who are available or involved in the emergency response”

Ontario's IMS Doctrine



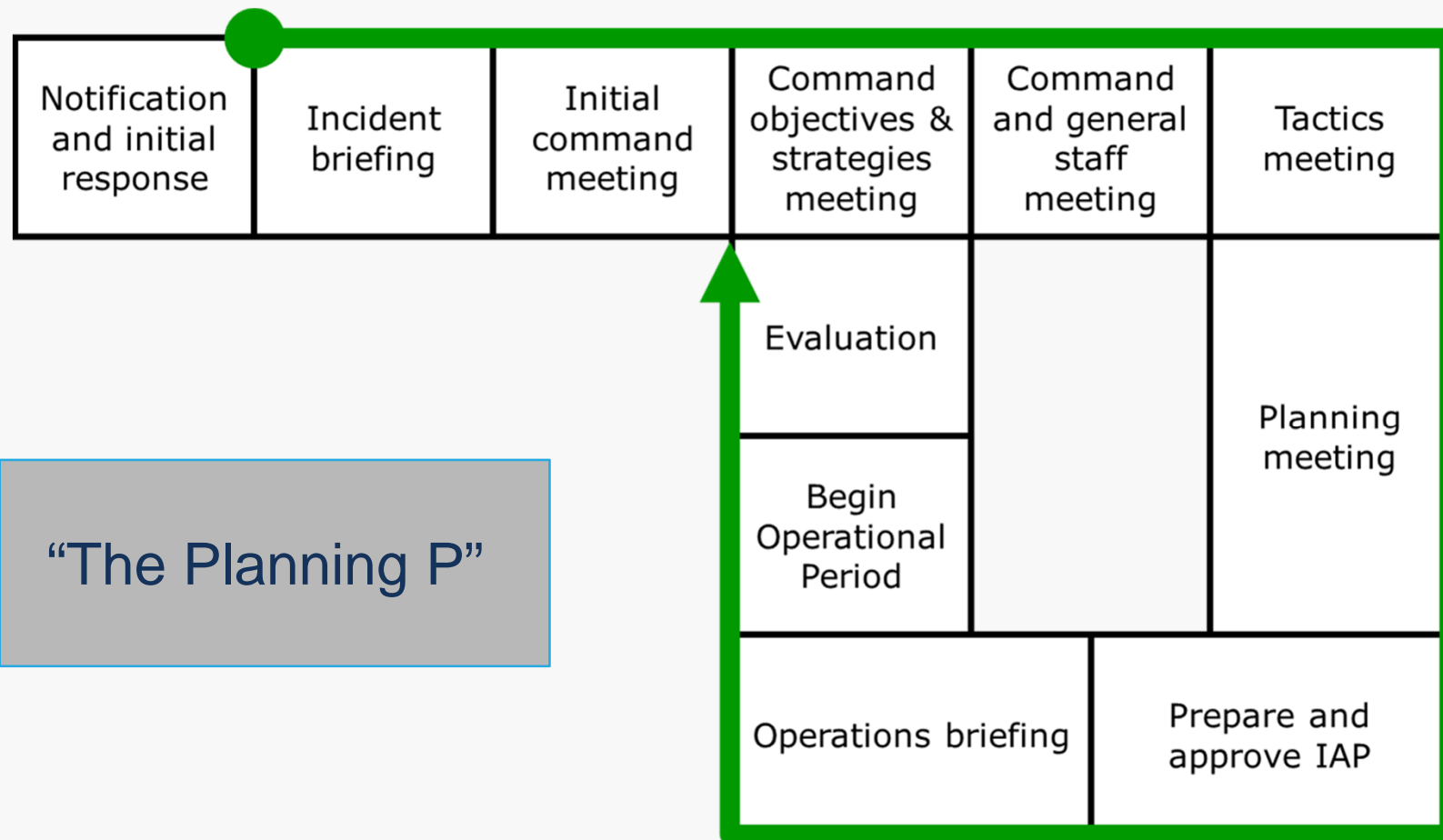


INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (IMS)

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SUPPORT ORGANIZATION EXPECTATIONS

PREVENT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Avoid abnormal exposure to risks if you are on shift as a response asset, as designated by your organization
MITIGATE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure your loved ones are prepared to take care of themselves during an emergency so that you can respond
PREPARE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Proactive maintenance and testing of equipment, protocols Training and exercises: individual and collective
RESPOND	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Formal activation by Niagara Health Organization-specific reference materials stored with equipment on-site
RECOVER	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Initiate relief-shift coverage (stand-by or activation) Sustainability of operations, self-care





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
